## Modern Slavery Act Statement

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 of the UK Modern Slavery Act 2015.

Sarum Hall School ("the School") opposes slavery and human trafficking in all its forms and does not tolerate it within our organisation or within our supply chain.

The School aspires to the highest standard of ethical behaviour and integrity. The School's commitment is reflected in our values and policies on equal opportunity and diversity and considers the risk of slavery or human trafficking occurring within the School's core activities to be low.

As regard to the School's suppliers, we are undertaking the following:

- Mapping our first tier supply chain, with the material supply chain risk identified as Facilities Management goods and services, including:
  - o Cleaning
  - o Catering
  - o Other property services such as electrical & plumbing;
- Seeking assurances from key suppliers identified by reference to risk factors, including country, sector, impact and annual value of services provided;
- Review and develop our procurement processes to ensure due consideration is given to the risk of slavery or human trafficking.

The School will also develop an internal Modern Slavery Policy.

We intend to continue our work in this area to comply with the Modern Slavery Act and to underscore the values and principles we seek to maintain.
